From the Pastor's Desk

With Advent we begin a new church year as we prepare once again to celebrate the birth of Jesus. It is fitting that we move from a season of giving thanks (as a nation) for all our blessings to a season of hope-filled expectation (as Christians) in the coming of God's greatest blessing! In these tumultuous times with so much anxiety in our nation and world about the present and future, it is all too easy to take those blessings for granted and dwell on the problems and perils. Both Thanksgiving and Advent encourage us to pause and count our blessings, and in so doing to express our gratitude to God from whom all our blessings flow. Some counselors encourage those dealing with sleepless nights or anxious days to pause at the end of the day and write down five blessings of that day. 



SEPTEMBER UPDATE: Well, it took a little while to get all of our ducks (or corn cobs) in a row, but it's finally here - our September úpdate! In September, some of our team traveled around the country to visit farmers we've trained who have already started implementing the regenerative agriculture practices. We're so excited to show you their harvest and let you hear, directly from them, how excited they are about what this means for them, their families, their communities, and their ministries. OCTOBER UPDATE:

In October, we were invited to an underdeveloped, rural community in the far interior of Benue State to train 1,000 local farmers! Over a period of six days, Raph and two other team members conducted a series of 1-day trainings and were able to train the first set of almost 400 farmers! We now have invitations to do similar trainings in Plateau State and Oyo State. These 1-day, on-site trainings help us to empower entire communities in an efficient and cost-effective manner while also selecting key people within

the community to receive further in-depth training and serve as community farm supervisors. While it's exciting to be able to help these families feed themselves and start making a profit through regenerative farming, what's even more exciting is the opportunity to talk to hundreds of villagers every day about the redemptive work of Christ. The cost of training 400 farmers: \$2,000 The joy of sharing the redemptive work of Christ through regenerative agriculture: Priceless!
