

Amid all the doom and gloom from the chaos in our country and world these days, there are some rays of sunshine that offer hope for the future. Three experiences over the past several weeks have inspired such hope for me. The first is the group of students from the University of Maryland who spent last week with us on their spring break so that they could work with Renewing Homes Augusta. They ate and slept here at the church and worked on projects during the day, building a porch and installing a ramp for neighbors in our community. Rather than basking on a Florida beach or chilling at home, they chose to spend their free week here, helping strangers in need in a community that none of them had ever visited before. They are great young people, and their commitment to give of their time and themselves in service to others is inspiring. Our thanks to all who helped to make them feel welcome in their brief time here!

The second experience was the baptism of little Ellie last Sunday with the host of our young children all around her. In baptism we welcome a new child into our family of faith, and we commit to show her the love of God and to teach her the stories of Jesus. # A NOTE FROM RAE —

Spring is upon us! And with the beginning of the spring comes all the excitement of planning for summer and dreaming about the new academic year in the fall. Offering spaces for thoughtful discussion and wonder, opportunities for relationship building and story sharing, and robust foundation building for discipleship require a lot of hands on deck.

Every Sunday morning, 16 people are helping shepherd learners across this building. That doesn't include the ones that give up their time on Friday evenings or Sunday afternoons for youth group or confirmation or the ones that build spaces for fellowship outside of our classrooms. We are blessed with a team of dedicated teachers, but as our programs grow, we need more people who are willing to share in this work.

Working with children and youth can be a daunting task. But it is also rewarding beyond measure. I would like to build our teams for the fall now, so that in May and during the summer, I can support them with strategies to help them feel comfortable facilitating learning in children's Sunday School classrooms. Curriculum is only part of that. Understanding how our children learn, how to manage emotions and behavior, and how to invite them into learning spaces is also vitally important to create nurturing learning spaces our children need more than ever these days. If you are interested in learning more about our Christian formation teams, the commitment of time, and the specific tasks of each member of the team, talk to me.

In April and May, I will be leading a Sunday School class about parenting and faith. We will discuss how to help nurture our children's

emotional and mental health, practical tips for encouraging faith formation at home, and how we are already more equipped for this work than we think. Anyone can come to this class and learn how to be a church parent for all the church children.

We have ten kids going to Montreat this summer.

Another six are heading to Massanetta. This is amazing!

Camps and conferences like this offer a time for kids to solidify bonds with their church friends and allow them to set aside all the mess of the world and sit with God's word in loving community with kids from all over the United States. It lets them see how big this faith thing is and how they are part of much bigger family.

But they can't go alone. We need more chaperones to go with us – one more for Montreat and one more for Massanetta. Chaperones are invited to participate fully in the life of the conference, attending worship and back-home group meetings, as well as taking part in small groups and recreation time. But you are absolutely able to participate in ways that value any limitations you have – you don't have to do cartwheels and climb mountains if you don't want to. The only thing you HAVE to be able to do is drive a couple of kids to and from the conference and care about our kids!

We are going to Massanetta on Thursday, June 19 and returning Sunday, June 22. The Montreat trip is from Sunday, July 6 to Saturday, July 12. Prayerfully consider whether God is calling you to serve in this way and let me know if you have any questions or are ready to sign up!


