# From the Pastor's Desk

On November 14, Covenant will be hosting Shenandoah Presbytery for their quarterly meeting. Shenandoah Presbytery includes about 90 PCUSA churches from Martinsburg, WV, in the north to Buena Vista in the south, from Warrenton, VA, in the east to Keyser and Romney, WV, in the west. There are churches large and small, with Covenant among the five largest churches in the presbytery. A couple of those churches have been around for more than 250 years! Most of the churches have less than a hundred members and were founded at a time when folks needed to be within a convenient buggy ride from their homes. Today, many of those churches in rural areas with small populations are strugaling – over a third of the churches in the presbytery have no installed pastor – and their future is uncertain. However, in churches large and small there are vibrant ministries reaching out to assist neighbors in need and to share the good news of the Gospel in word and deed throughout the year and across the years.

Hosting presbytery reminds us that we are part of a Church that is much larger than ourselves. There are over a million Presbyterians across the country, and they come in many shapes and sizes, with racial, ethnic, and linguistic diversities that reflect the richness of God's creative hand. What unites us is our common calling as disciples of the risen Christ within a Reformed tradition that affirms our salvation by the grace

# A NOTE FROM RAE —

It's November already! We have had a busy start to the Christian Formation year! In September, several youths participated in a mini-mission event at Jones Garden, helping to plant and weed the garden that supports those in need in Augusta County. In October, several others participated in sharing hospitality and welcoming people at our church's booth at Staunton Pride. Our young Faith Explorers group has met twice, shared dinner, played games, and learned about the Fruit of the Spirit. Our Middle School Manna group has begun a study on mission and justice. The confirmation class, in addition to their regular classes, completed a church visit to Greater Allen AME in October, which led to some great conversations about the church and theology.

# VITH KATHY HENDERSON, RN

We all "know" that older people are at risk of falling and hurting themselves. But did you know that of the approximately 8.5 million fall-related visits to hospital emergency rooms each year, only about 3 million were from elderly folks? (I didn't.)

More than a million of these visits were from children under 5, with maybe another half million from workers who had fallen on the job. That's a lot of young and (more likely) middle-aged fall victims.

So . . . you Gen X'ers and Millennials among us might want to leave the office early on Wednesday to attend Gretchen Cassell's "Slips, Trips and Falls." Gretchen, Covenant member and veteran physical therapist, will discuss why we fall, the aftereffects of falls, and how to "fall-proof" ourselves.

Fall-related injuries have long been considered a serious public health issue in general and a major concern among the elderly. A small, 2022 "fall prediction" study published in Aging Medicine and Healthcare Journal concluded that: "Falls directly increased with age . . . from 18% in the young age group (20 to 45 years) to 21% in the middle-aged group (46 to 65 years), and to 35% in the older-aged group (65+ years)." A separate CDC study indicates that fall risk doubles at age 85.

Among the middle-aged participants, specific fall-risk predictors included: medications, lack of physical activity, and newly-discovered chronic health issues, such as diabetes, COPD, and arthritis. These risks – added to vision and hearing problems, decreasing muscle mass, and chronic physical ailments – increase exponentially as we age. Although fall-related injury death statistics for the middle-aged are difficult to find, dozens of government and private groups track this issue among the elderly and the statistics are scary.

More than 41,000 older (65+) Americans died of fall-related injuries in 2023. Hundreds of thousands more suffered post-fall complications, including (but not limited to) broken bones, brain injury, and debilitating lack of confidence in one's ability to function without help. Given the overwhelming amount of not-always-helpful or accurate information available, where do we start in our quest to live fall-free lives?

Check your meds. The electronic medical records equipment at medical facilities (including urgent care offices and our three area hospitals) does not speak the same language. Check your meds list every time you visit a doctor or hospital: You may be surprised (horrified) by the mistakes you catch. There is also a great deal of conflicting information about what is or isn't helpful. Vitamins D and B, often touted as balance helpers, are toxic if the wrong dose is ingested. Talk to your health provider about all your meds, but especially melatonin, anti-psychotics, anti-depressants, bladder control, or muscle spasm treatments.

Do a self-checkup. "Stay Independent," a CDC fall risk assessment pamphlet, is helpful. Several copies are on my office desk. Please take one.
