

From the Pastor's Desk

With the carols and stories of Christmas still ringing in our ears and the dawn of a new year on the horizon, we Christians, of all people, should be hopeful. The hope we hold is not grounded in the promises of any president or the results of any polls; it is not grounded in the stock market or the weather forecast or the potential of our favorite sports team; it is not dependent upon world events or the illusion of some alternate reality that denies the reality on the ground. Our hope is grounded instead in those promises incarnate in the child in Bethlehem who is the savior of the world and our Lord!

At the time of his birth, the world was a mess with the Pax Romana violently enforced with crucifixions and violence; a paranoid Herod ordered the slaughter of all male children under two years of age, forcing the holy family to flee to Egypt; in his ministry Jesus was rejected in his hometown, derided by the Jewish authorities, and chided by his own followers for not being the king they wanted him to be. He was put to death on a cross for all the world to see. And after his resurrection some sought to undermine its truth while others simply declared it untrue. If anyone had reason to be hopeless about the world, it should have been Jesus. Yet, he never gave up hope; he never stopped loving his neighbors; he never compromised the good news of God's love for the world by adopting the sinful values of that broken world. Instead, he trusted God – fully, completely – and offered us an example of how to live faithfully.

At its stated meeting on December 21, the Session took the following actions:

- ◆ Approved support for the pastors' endorsement of an ecumenical statement on Christian Nationalism
- ◆ Elected Bob Stripling and Tom Brooks as commissioners to the February meeting of presbytery
- ◆ Approved team assignments for 2026, elected Paul Sorrell as Treasurer, and by virtue of office appointed Paul Sorrell, Bob Stripling, and Jane Wimmer as trustees
- ◆ Approved a budget for 2026 in the amount of \$710,000
- ◆ Approved \$800 for afterschool snacks for a tutoring program at Ware Elementary School
- ◆ Approved special offerings and communion dates for 2026
- ◆ Approved four facility use requests
- ◆ Appointed Jane Sawyer and Louise Scott to the Endowment and Memorial Fund Committee, Class of 2028
- ◆ Approved moving Presbyterian Women from Congregational Care to Christian Formation in reporting to Session




